- Three (3) Main cranes now onsite to support turbine installation

Moorabool Wind Farm Connects to the Victorian Transmission Network

In July, Moorabool North wind farm connected to the Victorian transmission network.

"As part of the commissioning phase that is currently underway on the northern section of the Moorabool Wind Farm, the project is now connected to the Victorian transmission network and is generating electricity."

"Construction of the southern section of the Moorabool Wind Farm is continuing to make good progress and is expected to be completed later this year."

"Once fully operational, the 312 MW 104-wind turbine project will be one of the largest wind farms in Victoria and will directly employ up to 20 permanent full-time maintenance roles," said Mr Titchen.

Landscape and Visual Screening Program

All residences within 4 kilometres of a wind turbine at Moorabool Wind Farm and have one or more turbines visible within 4km of the residence are eligible to take part in the Landscape and Visual Screening Program.

It is not compulsory. Conditions 21 and 22 of the Planning Permit relate to the Landscape and Visual Screening Program. Interested owners of residences must apply within 12 months of the last wind turbine becoming operational.
